Hunter Mountain Upgrades for 2024-2025 Season

Hunter Mountain will automate a significant portion of its snowmaking operations, enhance efficiency, and expand the skiable terrain during the crucial early season. One of the key improvements will be the automation of 70 snow guns on the Belt Parkway trail. The Clair's Way trail will also receive cutting-edge, low-energy snowmaking technology. In addition, the Way Out trail will install 32 new automated snow guns which will connect Hunter North and Hunter West more directly and earlier in the season. Hunter Mountain is installing a new 6-person, high-speed lift to replace the Broadway quad. It will provide quicker mid-mountain access from the base lodge for the easier and intermediate runs such as Mossy Brook, Madison Avenue, and Kennedy Drive. The existing Broadway quad will then replace the old 2-person fixed-grip E lift on Hunter East. The improvements should be complete for the 2024-2025 season. Warning: Credit Card Fraud Continues to Target Ski Areas

SAM Magazine—Red Lodge, Mont., March 7, 2024—There appears to be an extensive effort to sell fraudulently purchased lift tickets on Craigslist at a discounted price, with dozens of ski areas across North America being targeted. Fraud Officials at Red Lodge Mountain, Montana, recently caught on to the scam, and confronted guests who had purchased tickets from a Craigslist user for 50% off. Like many people who are lured by the prospect of a good deal on lift tickets, the guests were unaware that it was a scam. Red Lodge got law enforcement involved to help investigate. Read more. Okemo January 5-10

We can either rent a couple of condos the week before if the conditions are good or we can use the Mid Jersey Ski house. The Mid Jersey Ski house is more of a group house with many beds and a large kitchen. You would have to bring your own bedding and you can cook meals there or go out. We would have to clean up before we leave. It is about 25 minutes to Okemo and is about \$35 a night and \$15 membership fee to the Mid Jersey Ski Club.. You would have to commit about a week or two before the trip. We would like everyone's feedback.

Mt Snow January 20-24

Last year a few of us rented a condo and others stayed at a hotel near Mt. Snow. Either way we had to drive to the slopes. The condo came to less then \$100 a day for each person in the condo.

Attitash February 8-14

Last year we stayed at the Grand Summit at Attitash and it was ski in and ski out. Some of the condos had kitchens and there was a pool and hot tub. We are working on the price. If we go to the Grand Summit, we would have to commit early and there would be no money refunded if you could not make it unless you purchase travel insurance. The grooming wasn't great. We can also use Pollard Brook Condos. The cancellation policy is 72 hours prior to check in, 2 bedroom, two bath, living room, and kitchen is \$1275. It has a bedroom with a queen bed, bedroom with twin beds and pullout couch in the living room. Indoor pool and large outdoor hot tub. Divide it by 4 and it's under \$400 dollars each. We can also use many of the Hotels in Lincoln.

We then can ski Attitash or Wildcat with our Epic Pass, Bretton Woods or Loon not on Epic Pass.

Stowe March 2-7

Last year we stayed at the Commodore Inn and we would like to return. Everyone will make their own reservations that you would be able to cancel up to the day before we arrive. You pay when you get there and if you have a roommate you can split charges on credit cards. There is a pool and several hot tubs, light breakfast, and a shuttle to Stowe that stops in front of the hotel. There is also a lobby with a huge fireplace where we have happy hour everyday. Five nights for 2 people is about \$875 for 5 nights and 4 nights for 2 people is about \$700.
